ESQHA Awards and Horse Show Points
ESQHA year-end awards are based on the members acquiring the
most horse-show points from approved ESQHA shows, in the year
beginning January 1 <sup>st</sup> thru October 31.
1. Points will be kept on horses belonging to ESQHA members
only. Please make sure that the OWNER of the horse has a
current membership. All owners and riders must have current
AQHA memberships.
2. Memberships must be paid in full to the secretary prior to any
points being kept. The postmark date will denote the date the
membership is received. Farms are considered to be a "family
membership," and dues should be paid accordingly. NOTE:
Youth memberships must also acquire ESQHA membership to
be eligible for ESQHA year-end awards.
3. Only shows that are ESQHA approved (listed in the newsletter)
will count toward year-end awards.
4. A member must receive points in at least five (5) approved
shows per event before becoming eligible for an award. If any
class is not offered in at least five approved shows, no award
will be given.
5. All ESQHA approved shows and Special Events will count for
points.
6. Halter horses standing Grand Champion at halter at AQHA
approved shows will receive one (1) more point than any other
horse in his/her sex division, regardless of age.
7. Halter horses standing Reserve Champion at halter at AQHA
approved shows will receive one-half point more than any other
horse in his/her sex division, regardless of age, except the
Grand Champion for that sex division.
8. Year-end awards will be presented at the ESQHA Convention.
9. All state points received by ESQHA members from the ESQHA
May spring shows will be doubled for year-end awards. (see
Amendments No. 11)
ESQHA Year-End High Points
The following is a summary of the hi-point awards offered by ESQHA
and how the calculations are made.
Amateur Halter
<b>Hi-Point &amp; Reserve:</b> Hi-point awards for mares, stallions and
geldings are determined by the horse/exhibitor
combination with the highest number of points from
both age divisions. Horses must receive a minimum
of 10 points to qualify for a reserve hi-point division
award.
Amateur Western
Hi-Point & Reserve: Any horse/exhibitor combination that has
accumulated the highest number of points in the

	of 5 halter points in the open division, and at least 5
	points in any western classes and 5 points in any
	English classes. Green working hunter points will
	not count towards the open all around award.
